Robby Mills is a rock-ribbed conservative with a history of beating legacy Democrats in a historically strong Democrat region.

In 2018, Mills defeated longtime state senator and Senate Minority Leader Dorsey Ridley by 484 votes. In 2022, Mills won re-election with a whopping 66 percent of the vote.

In 2016, Mills defeated longtime Democrat state representative Dr. David Watkins, flipping control of the state house to Republicans for the first time in 100 years.

Robby Mills is a respected leader from Western Kentucky, an area critical to beating Andy Beshear.

Robby Mills was one of the architects of the Western Kentucky Tornado Relief Bill. Mills has raised questions about Beshear's handling of the tornado relief efforts, especially the administration's decision to send an untold amount of \$1,000 checks to people unaffected by the tornadoes.

Robby Mills represents Dawson Springs, a Beshear family stronghold.

If elected as Lieutenant Governor, Robby Mills would be the only constitutional officer who lives west of I-65, giving western Kentucky a seat at the table for important policy discussions in Frankfort.

Robby Mills has previously served as the chair of the Western Kentucky Legislative Caucus.

Robby Mills can help broker a new era of cooperation between a Cameron Administration, the General Assembly, and local officials.

As a respected State Senator, Chairman of Senate State & Local Government Committee and a former member of the House of Representatives, Robby Mills has the relationships in the legislature to deliver on Day One for Kentucky.

Robby Mills has fought for and voted for legislation to ban children from accessing life-altering drugs and sex-change surgeries. Andy Beshear vetoed that measure.

Robby Mills has fought for election integrity, passing a number of bipartisan measures to increase faith in our elections, which Andy Beshear vetoed.

Robby Mills was the lead sponsor of Senate Bill 2, which requires Kentuckians to show a government-issued photo ID to vote. [Public polling shows that nearly 80 percent of Americans support photo ID requirements to vote.](#) Andy Beshear vetoed that bill.

Robby Mills was the lead sponsor for Senate Bill 216, which included a mandatory transition to paper ballots and places voting machines under video surveillance when they’re not being used. Senate Bill 216 passed the General Assembly with nearly unanimous support, but Andy Beshear vetoed it.

Robby Mills has been a defender of Kentucky’s fossil fuel industry and Kentucky coal.

Mills introduced Senate Bill 4 to ensure the transition to other forms of energy – like wind and solar – doesn’t happen at a rate that jeopardizes the reliability and affordability of electricity in Kentucky.

Beshear says he is for coal country but refused to sign Senate Bill 4. Beshear can’t pretend to be a champion of coal [while publicly supporting Hillary Clinton and Joe Biden's war on traditional energy.](#)

Mills also led the charge to pass some of the strongest anti-ESG legislation in the country, which helps protect Kentucky’s fossil fuel industry.

Robby Mills is a businessman and job creator, who has led in cutting taxes and wants to grow Kentucky’s economy.

Robby Mills and his family have owned Nu-Look Cleaners since 1970, with locations in Henderson, Madisonville, Morganfield, Hopkinsville and Evansville.
